



Adventure Consultant:

Sport Animator or Active Healthy Living Consultant

Adventure Education:

Any activity that requires specialized supervision and planning involving high risk and/or activities in a remote area.

High Risk:

Potential danger for death or dismemberment as determined in the risk assessment.

Remote Area:

A remote area is considered more than 1km from any area that provides accessible and reliable transportation.

Extended Trips:

An extended trip consists of three or more nights away from home/school.

Qualified and informed chaperones:

All chaperones (teachers, parents, etc.) must have knowledge related to the activity and be aware of their responsibilities as a chaperone. They must have a completed criminal record check and child abuse registry form submitted to the school board office. If they are driving they must have a completed J-form submitted to the school.

School Site Contact Person:

A designated person at the school who does not attend the trip, but who will hold all information pertaining to the trip (trip plan, emergency contact lists, phone numbers, etc.). This person's contact information (work and home) must be given to parents in case they need to be in touch with their children or the trip leader while they are on the trip.

Trip Leader:

The AVRSB staff member who is in charge of organizing and/or leading the adventure education activity.

PE Safety Guidelines, P-12 re Supervision:

Constant visual supervision means that the teacher is physically present, watching the activity in question. Example: climbing wall – the teacher is at the climbing wall and is observing activity.

On-site supervision entails teacher presence but not necessarily constantly viewing one specific activity. Example: canoeing – students are practicing canoeing and can be seen by the teacher.

In-the-area supervision means that the teacher could be in the gym while another activity is taking place in an area nearby the gym. Example: camping – students are camping and at times may be out of sight.
